faculty members in the regular colleges. Where we need the attorney's though who teach the legal courses, not that they are going to teach them to be lawyers, they are just going to teach some to be claims adjusters, loan closers, management of law offices, and that sort of thing. These instructors will actually come from volunteer attorneys in the Omaha area. This is a \$25,000 appropriation to give them the miscellaneous expenses needed for that particular program. I would move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: If you are in favor of the amendment vote aye, if not vote no. This is the second Goodrich amendment involving \$25,000 for Para-legal services at UNO. Once again have you all voted? Clerk will record. And the results are.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 15 nays.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The motion fails.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, I have one further Goodrich amendment which is found in the journal identified as number three. It is found on page 1318.

PRESIDENT: Stand by, is this number 3 meaning ..

CLERK: Found on the journal on page 1318.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. It would be the third section of the amendment for. Is that correct?

CLERK: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Page 62, line 26 down. All right.

CLERK: Page 66, line 12

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Goodrich back to you.

SENATOR GOODRICH: O.K. Now this amendment is for \$160,000 and it's to finish the Laminer Flow Unit that we discussed this morning. This is the isolation ward. That would be used to treat a person if they became contaminated in either of the nuclear generating plants. Inthe meantime however, while we will be waiting for one of those accidents to happen, we hope it never happens, we at least are going to be able to use it for various other uses such as cancer research. This is something that we just absolutely have to have at the Med Center if we want to avoid contaminating a complete hospital with a accident victim from one of the nuclear generating plants. If we don't have an isolation ward to take them in to, and to clean him off, and to get him up to a thorough setting for the treatment from that point forward to recovery, then we would contaminate the entire hospital. And for that reason we must finish this project that we started last year. I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The first to speak is Senator Moylan and then Senator Stahmer and then Senator Clark. Senator Moylan.
