SENATOR NORE: Senator Chamber, I would like to have him come out and follow me for a year. He said that I don't work. I would like to have him come out and work with some of the boys that do help me. We don't have minimum wage on the farm but we pay the boys what they are worth. Some \$2.00 and some \$1.25 and one fellow 75¢ and I get along real well but I do it out of sympathy. It is the greatest therapy that he gets a job and comes out there and has something to do. Otherwise he is decaying in town.
