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should be treated as a criminal. Therefore, I'd ask this Body to certainly support the adoption of this amendment and to start something that this state has needed for a long time.

PRESIDENT: Now, Senator Richendifer, do you want to discuss the committee amendments? All right. Senator Kremer, you're next to be heard on the committee amendments only. That's all we're discussing, the committee amendments and the adoption of them at this time.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman....

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, these actually should be referred to as the Barnett amendments rather than the committee amendments.

SENATOR KREMER: Well.....

PRESIDENT: Wait a minute....whoops....Senator DeCamp, what's the problem back there?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, in order to save time and I'm sure everybody should want to do this. The committee amendments up there are the bill. Why don't we adopt those and let's go to a quick test and see how much strength the bill has. If it doesn't have enough strength, there is no use wasting an awful lot of time on it.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Kremer, we're discussing the committee amendments.

SENATOR KREMER: Mr. Chairman, could I ask Senator DeCamp relating to the committee amendments?

PRESIDENT: You may. Senator DeCamp, yield to a question?

SENATOR KREMER: I think you might have touched upon it but I could hardly hear when you did. Where will these rehabilitation centers or what hospitals will be authorized to give this treatment that you speak about?

SENATOR DE CAMP: Senator Kremer, now you're getting into an area that can't have specific answers because this would be up to the rules and regulations and program developed by this commission. But a general idea is that existing hospitals would be used in some cases. In other cases, it's thought that private organizations might set up rehabilitation centers that would be funded at least in part or totally from the funds raised through this bill. So it's an impossible question, but you can generally believe that existing things would be used as far as possible.

SENATOR KREMER: Well, Senator DeCamp, I believe after the next question I want to ask, the fiscal note that's in our books, does that apply to the amendments or not?

SENATOR DE CAMP: How much is it?

SENATOR KREMER: Four million dollars.

SENATOR DE CAMP: I think we cut that in about half, didn't we? We got it down to about one million.
