SENATOR CARPENTER: Now the amount of money that Senator Stromer is suggesting will be earmarked for this purpose. Two purposes. Reduce the tuition, or to use it for scholarships in order to increase the number of the number of students going to the four normal schools, if that's the right word. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Senator Carpenter, a point of clarification. Did you say to on the tuition aspect of it, I understand the scholarship. Did you say possibly to use the money to reduce tuition?

SENATOR CARPENTER: The whole purpose of it is to get kids in this school, or these four schools. It has a dual purpose. You can reduce the tuition to the extent of the money appropriated. Or you can use it to give tuition free to scholars. Either free or part as the school might want to do it.

SENATOR STAHMER: Well, I was just questioning whether the fact if you lowered the tuition, whether it would end the benefiting. Maybe you are right. We can talk to them later I'll support it for now.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, we'll just leave it to the school to do what they think they ought to do.

SENATOR STAHMER: All right.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on the Carpenter amendment to the Stromer amendment. If not, are you ready for the question? It takes a majority of those voting, and that's for the reason we are just getting the amendment in final shape. All those in favor of the Carpenter amendment vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted. The Carpenter amendment to the Stromer amendment. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 16 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stromers, amendment is now amended by the Carpenter amendment. Senator Stromer.

SENATOR STROMER: I move the amendment be adopted as amended.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. The question is, shall the amendment be adopted as amended. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. It requires 25 votes. Voting for the adoption of the Stromer amendment or it's rejection. Have you all voted? I'm about to call for the recording of the votes. Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Clerk will clear the board. Senator Carpenter has asked for a Call of the House. At the bell please indicate whether or not you support a Call of the House. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted. Clerk will re...record the vote.

CLERK: 15 ayes, to go under Call, Mr. President.
