PRESIDENT: The amendments are withdrawn. What is the next amendment, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Chambers. It is found on page 1378 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chambers amendment found on page 1378. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This is an amendment that I talked to most of you about. It deals with the program in Omaha called Opportunities Industrialization Center. It takes people who are unemployed or underemployed, school dropouts, people who have had jobs and lost them and gives them training and in a variety of areas. I handed out a little booklet that mentions some of the areas of training. Like typing, stenographic shorthand, keypunch, merchandizing, marketing, machine tool operating, drafting classes, etc. This program has been in operation several years. Some of you have visited the installation yourself. The Governor has been there. This program was included in the Governor's Budget, but since this bill stayed in the appropriations committee it became necessary to put these funds into one of these appropriations bills. So I ask that you adopt the amendment.

PRESIDENT: You have heard Senator Chambers explain the amendment. Is there any discussion? If not, are you ready for the question? Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Requires 25 votes. It's on the adoption of the Chambers amendment. Clerk will record.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. The next amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Savage. It's found on page 1379 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: This is the Savage amendment found on page 1379 of the Legislative Journal. Senator Savage.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature. This is an amendment to clarify the language that didn't seem clear according to a newspaper article I read to the Ward of the Voc Tech Schools. And it merely specifies that it doesn't change the amount of money that the appropriation committee put in the bill, but it does specify that they should be for ten non-athletic tuition waivers to be granted to Nebraska resident students. I move for the adoption.

PRESIDENT: All right, you have the explanation by Senator Savage. Is there any discussion on this amendment. If all those in favor of Senator Savage's amendment vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Requires 25 votes. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Amendment is adopted. Read the next amendment.

CLERK: The next amendment is by Senator Kelly. It is found on page 1379.
