PRESIDENT: I'm going to allow one minute discussion on this because I've already made my decision. Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: I agree with what Senator Duis does. Wait until we get to Select File.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, I would assume we can do the very same thing on Select File as we do on General File if he wishes to strip the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Fellman.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Well, does the Chair rule, I object to this and I would like to....okay....

PRESIDENT: Let the Chair...I can end this discussion right now. Is..this is on a mere procedural question. We are on Final Reading and the motion's been made on Select File. I rule the motion....I rule with Senator Carpenter. I rule Senator Stahmer's motion out of order. We can come back to it when we reach Select File and that's the end of it. Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, please let me make a correction. It would go to the top of General File, not to the bottom of General File, if he's fortunate enough to return it.

PRESIDENT: Well yes, we'll take that one when we come to it.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President....

PRESIDENT: The motion?

CLERK: LB977 unanimous consent to unbracket it. Then a motion to return to Select File for specific amendment. Signed, Senator Stahmer.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President and members of the Body. I'll be very brief in this. I talked to Senator Chambers. He did not want to combine these two motions into one which is fine by me, take them one at a time, live or die. I won't bleed on it. Very quickly, this amendment would take LB977 back to Select File, it would gut the bill. It would insert in the bill that for three months, people on ADC would receive a \$4 supplement check solely to buy fresh meat. Now, there's a meat glut in the state and this is designed to help relieve the meat glut and also to help the people on ADC in one fell swoop. It would...we are currently at 80% of need. This would raise us to about 85% of need for those three months. I think it's humanitarian and I think it would help the farmers. And I urge the adoption of the motion to return this to Select File to do this purpose.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I think if I stood here about twelve minutes, I could come up with 100 meriterous ideas that would help one group or another and solve some problem or another and solve....but
