And has not funded us appropriately taken cognizance of that fact and this is what this amendment would tend to remedy. We've cut our request in half. From \$1,500,000 to \$750,000, it's a reasonable request to provide quality technical education in the City of Omaha and I urge its support.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I'd have to ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Clerk will clear the board.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: And also a record vote on this.

PRESIDENT: Record vote's been requested. All in favor of a Call of the House vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Question is, shall there be a Call of the House? Have you all voted? Senator Schmit voting aye. You voting aye on the Call of the House? Senator Schmit voting aye on the original motion. We have to go under Call first. Either we do or we don't. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 19/18 to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: House under Call. Please record your presence.

CLERK: Senator Schmit voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Record your presence. House under Call.

CLERK: Cal Carsten changing from no to aye. Senator Barnett voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark. Senator Clark has moved the Call be raised. Clerk will clear the board. Those in favor of raising the Call, vote aye. Senator Syas?

SENATOR SYAS: Can't you take exception to that?

PRESIDENT: Yes, you can take exception but I'm putting the motion. Yes, you can except it but I'm putting the motion. The motion has been made to raise the Call. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Motion to raise the Call. Have you all voted? LAST TIME. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 19 nays to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: Simple majority. The motion passes. Now the Clerk will read the Roll.

CLERK: Read Roll.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, the senator from Omaha has asked for a Roll Call vote. He was in the midst of calling out the vote. Clerk will take the vote by Roll Call. This
