SENATOR WHITNEY: Senator Stahmer, another question. This \$250,000 then becomes the amendment rather than the Marvel amendment, is that correct?

SENATOR STAHMER: That is correct.

SENATOR WHITNEY: So we delete, take out, the \$192,000. Put the \$250,000 in and then have a different method of distribution.

SENATOR STAHMER: That is my understanding.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: All right, is there any further discussion? This is the Stahmer amendment to the Marvel amendment. Are you ready for the question? Now, this is an amendment to an amendment and it requires a majority of those voting. All those in favor of the.....Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Well, just a word of closing. These schools are very unevenly distributed, out in the state and some have had long histories. Some have had short. I think this is the fairest way to try to bring some remission and help the poor student get into a school no matter where he lives.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer is closing or has closed. All those in favor of the Stahmer amendment, vote aye. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Requires a majority of those voting. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 23 ayes, 13 nays.

PRESIDENT: Amendment passes. We're back to the Marvel amendment. Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: I move the amendment as amended be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Are you ready for the question? All those in favor of the Marvel amendment vote aye. Those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 10 nays.

PRESIDENT: Amendment's adopted. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Oh yes. Mr. President, another amendment offered by Senator Keyes which is as follows. On page 11, strike the following language. (Clerk read amendment found on page 1454 of Journal).

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I'm not going to make a lot of talk on this. I just simply want to know that there will be three campuses that will ably serve the community. They will not be all built in one camp so it's the understanding I think we have but I'd like to have it in the statutes that there will be three.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.
