SENATOR NORE: Would you think it would be good to have the same rule here in the Legislature?

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Nore, if I am working at a full time job at something else, I don't think it would hurt a bit as far as working and this is not a full time job, Senator Nore. This is a part time job 60 days one year and 90 the other.

SENATOR NORE: And I think...I'm sure that the Board of Regents did stop the abortion problem we had over there. And I think they could probably handle this very expeditiously and I don't think we have any business in this area at all.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I back Senator Keyes' amendment. I think it's a good amendment. I think it's time this Legislature pass legislation of this type. We've had this situation in our own county. It could just as well work for the universities and I can't see why the Legislature can't take the wheel here and to pass legislation. The amendment, Senator Keyes, would be good to know where these monies are being paid out and what these people are doing and whether they're using our facilities and where else they're working.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: I move the previous question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark has called for the previous question. All those...do I see five hands? All those in favor of ceasing debate vote aye. Those opposed vote no. This requires 25 votes. Motion has been made to cease debate. Have you all voted? The motion under consideration is to cease debate. I'm about to record the vote. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 10 nays, to cease debate.

PRESIDENT: Debate has ceased. Senator Keyes, you may close.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, I notice that it held at 23 votes for a long time. Then it went 26, we called for cease debate immediately. Senator Stahmer, who will lose to the constitutionality of it, has talked on many bills here this year. Probably a lot of them are unconstitutional. This is just an issue he brought up to try to kill it, that's all. I think the State of Nebraska is entitled to know when we hire a professor or a teacher at the University of Nebraska that if he is working full time some place else or making \$10,000 a year or more from working, from professional services he offers and not from any royalties from any book that he has written or any investments that he has along with Senator Whitney. I think we are entitled to know it. This is all it does and as far as the abortions in Omaha or at the University Medical School, this is one of the things that may come out of it. Certainly I think Senator Luedtke has a man working for him. We maybe will find out how much that man is making. We have a lot of people working for the State of Nebraska, for the University, enjoying two paychecks and possibly they are full time. I think we are entitled to know it. That's all. I close on that.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Keyes has closed. The question is, shall the Keyes amendment to LB1059 be adopted. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no.
