We take General Fund money to build the building. That's all I'm suggesting. And leaving the study the way it was by the budget committee. Now what is wrong with that. The Governor says he wants the building in Lincoln. We're letting the Governor appoint a committee to do an in depth analysis. And this should go on continuously. It isn't...we don't every come up with a super plan. And then set on it. This planning should go on and on and on, and it probably will go on forever. Because we never will have all the exact answers. But merely what I'm saying here is, if we want to build a building. Let's take the money out of General Funds. Let's not take it out of planning money. Let's the section alone, where the Governor can appoint a committee, and do the work. I think it's a constructive amendment, and it's very clean. And it leaves intact what the Budget Committee recommended. And it gives Senator Luedtke his money out of the General Fund, and it answers all of these problems.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer has closed. For what purpose do you rise, Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Just wanted to find out if that amendment was if it restores that particular section. I don't believe it does that, and I would object to it if it did, and I want to ask him if it restores the section whereby the Governor is commanded to appoint a committee.

SENATOR STAHMER: That is the intent of the motion.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, I don't...do you think we can command the Governor...

PRESIDENT: Senators, we have finished arguing about this. Have you closed, Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Yes.

PRESIDENT: All those in favor of the Stahmer amendment -to the Luedtke amendment vote aye. Those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Takes a majority of those voting. Senator Luedtke has requested a Call of the House. The Clerk will clear the board. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, those opposed vote no. This a motion for a Call of the House. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 15 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Clerk will announce the vote on the original motion.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 11 nays.

PRESIDENT: The amendment passes. The Stahmer amendments is adopted. Now we are back...Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Support this amendment any longer, and I'm going to try to move...I think I'll just move to have the whole amendment indefinitely...just kill the amendment. Because it just absolutely...

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.
