SENATOR CARPENTER: Now is 656 at the bottom of General File?

SPEAKER: Yes, it just dropped.

SENATOR CARPENTER: At the bottom?

SENATOR CARPENTER: I move Mr. President, that from now on we read all of the bills on General File.

SPEAKER: Under the rules, I asked the Clerk about this, can not any member ask for the reading of bills?

SENATOR CARPENTER: That is right.

SPEAKER: Any member can ask for the reading of bills so you DON'T have to move.

SENATOR CARPENTER: That is what I am asking, for the reading of all the bills on general file. I think that it is completely unfair and I don't care, (malfunction in machine) so if that is what you want to do, I want all of the bills read.

SPEAKER: Alright as the Chair understands it without looking at the rule book that is the way it will be unless somebody moves to suspend the rules. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. Chairman that is exactly what I am going to do. I think that Senator Carpenter has led this body down the path for a long enough time this session and I think that we separate him from the group, I move that we suspend the rules right now and forget about reading the bills and start out like we were going to because 127 is coming up and I think it ought to go aside, it has had a vote on it, forget it. Lets get back to 934 and get on with the business. Therefore I move that we suspend the rules and let the Pied Piper go on whistling Dixie or something.
