SENATOR WALDRON: Pass.

SPEAKER: Seantor Waldron passes, Seantor F. Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, I think that there is a delay tactic here and you know the purpose, and of course someone is trying to make the rest of us look bad, but I might remind you. Who moved to move the entire appropriation package over to Select File without one minute of debate. We are moving these off of General File only now. We are trying to expedite this and lets go with it.

SPEAKER: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Now, are we going to have unlimited time on Select File to debate these bills? That is what I intended in my motion. I'm getting a little irritated by this gentleman who is one of my opponents. Of course I'm going to use it against him, although I don't think that it will be necessary, to see what this body is doing. My motion did one thing to put them over there. Consider all of the amendments committee and otherwise and debate unlimited except under the rules. That is what I attempted to do and now you are saying that 10 minutes for 49 people and I want to ask when it gets on Select File are they debatable there?

SPEAKER: This motion as the Chair understands it was on General File, it had nothing to do with Select File or anything else.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I understand, but when it gets on Select File are they then debatable? Under the present rules.

SPEAKER: Certainly, they are debatable under the rules.

SENATOR CARPENTER: OK, I'll debate on that point.

SPEAKER: Alright we have heard enough of this argument now. Let's go on with the first bill. Mr. Clerk what is the first bill.
