

SPEAKER: Any further discussion on this? Seantor Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: I would just like to say that I support the Simpson amendment to my bill. I think that they strengthen it and make it a more workable program.

SPEAKER: Are you ready for the question? The question is shall the amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays Mr. President.

SPEAKER: Amendment is adopted. Any further amendments.

CLERK: Yes, read Goodrich amendment.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: I would like unanimous consent to withdraw the amendment.

SPEAKER: You don't have to, it is withdrawn. Any other amendments Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: None.

SPEAKER: Alright, Senator Fowler, what will you do with the bill?

SENATOR FOWLER: I might explain it then move it to be advanced. It simply allows cities of primary class to implement what is called a community development program. The bill follows an act in Washington the better communities act, and it is backed in Lincoln from groups from the chamber of commerce dependents groups and support also from my friend the Mayor. It really the intent is to combine housing authority powers with community development act powers that we passed in last years legislature. I move that it be advanced.

SPEAKER: You heard the explanation of the bill, Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I would like to ask Senator Fowler a question. What would be-.is there a limit on the mil levy that could be permitted here?

SENATOR FOWLER: This would fall within the regular mil levy limits that the city has in its charter.

SENATOR WHITNEY: There is no limit on the mil levy.

SENATOR FOWLER: This law doesn't alter any existing thing as far as the limits.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Then does this only apply to Lincoln?

SENATOR FOWLER: Cities of the primary class.

SENATOR WHITNEY: Thank you.
