

SENATOR BARNETT: I'm not opposed to it.

SPEAKER Can you do that Mr. Clerk? OK, it is done. Senator Fellman.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Will Senator Barnett yield to a question? Doesn't the....didn't the court decision tell you that you had to have this across the board, was it for metropolitan primary and first class cities?

SENATOR BARNETT: No they didn't say it quite that way. They said that if it was a primary class city it would be wrong, They didn't say where we would have to limit or where we could expand too.

SENATOR FELLMAN: As the bill now stands, it would affect, with Senator Carpenter's amendment it would affect both Omaha and Lincoln?

SENATOR BARNETT: That is right.

SENATOR FELLMAN: I think that somebody ought to point out to the Omaha Senators that this would do exactly what Senator chambers is talking about, and there have been a number of votes in Omaha against this by the public and I think that a....there is a tiger by the tail here that the city of Omaha Senators are not really aware of. That is that the city could now do this in Omaha, without a vote of the people and could take out...in effect, gets into the urban renewal business without the vote of the people. Now I have personally supported urban renewal but the Omaha Voters at least two or three times have turned these down, and the city council in Omaha has failed to do anything to change this. I think that someone should point out to the representatives of Omaha that this would open the door in Omaha for any type of urban renewal project that could be tied into the parking thing.

SPEAKER: 20 seconds to go.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. Chairman, members, I think that this bill probably has a license to eventually confiscate your property if they so desire and the city council. I think that it is bad, it was always bad to take the authority away from the people. I am against it. I have it marked with a big "NO" and I have been reading up in the literature, it is not good.

SPEAKER: The time has now expired. Time doesn't count now, it provides that we take a vote. So we all know that we are doing, I want to read at least the part or the last part of Senator DeCamp's motion. That we allow a maximum of 10 minutes per bill after which time a vote shall be taken on the bill. If the bill or a...a...falls to advance it shall be returned to the bottom of General File. I interpretation that to be that we take a vote on whether the bill shall advance. Is there any objection to that? That? That is the way the motion reads. What do you say Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: I agree with you except for the fact that here the committee amendments strike the bill and completely changes it. If you...

SPEAKER: Clerk just pointed out that in this situation the committee amendment strikes the bill, but that is besides the point. The question is shall the bill advance? Now that is
