

**SPEAKER:** Senator Syas.

**SENATOR SYAS:** Just one question, when these people came to see me they wanted things left alone, just like it is and I think that I will vote accordingly.

**SPEAKER:** Senator Fowler.

**SENATOR FOWLER:** I would have to rise to support the kill motion. I think that if the problem is that of what Senator Murphy outlined that the commission and director did not get along and there were problems in management of that, this amendment would not solve that at all. Rather we would find that the commission had no control over the director and would not be able to appoint it. If the Governor appointed a Director that the commission did not like, we would have greater problems and the commission director getting along and the commission would be in no position to solve this. I don't think that Senator Murphy's solution solves the problem that the commission is having in the past.

**SPEAKER:** Senator Snyder.

**SENATOR SNYDER:** Mr. President, members, I speak against the kill motion I speak in favor of the bill. Again it is a case in my opinion that we are delegating a lot of authority to non-elected people and we have got a check and balances system of government and for ever and ever we talk about bureaucracy but unfortunately we sometimes help probagate democracy or bureaucracy by allowing these commission, boards and bureaus a etc. to get along without being directly responsible to someone. Now we in the legislature stand election, the governor stands election and I personally think that if you are just going to have a director who is nothing but a rubber stamp for the commission you don't need the director. You can save yourself whatever salary he pays and let the commission run the whole show because if he is responsible to the commission, politically face it, be realistic, he is not going to bust that commission very long if he wants to keep his job. Lets not kill this bill, lets return some line and staff operation to state government and pass the bill.

**SPEAKER:** Senator Cavanaugh, you may close.

**SENATOR CAVANAUGH:** Mr. President...

**SENATOR MURPHY:** May I reply to the kill motion?

**SPEAKER:** Yes, you may, Senator you did not have your light on. Senator Murphy.

**SENATOR MURPHY:** Senator Cavanaugh you say that my proposal will destroy the commission. Can the commission be destroyed twice? Because if not, one of the directors, Miss Swambly reported last month when the Supreme Court upheld a lower court decision that the supreme court had already destroyed the commission so I would say that you as an officer of the court have already destroyed the commission that you say that I am proposing to destroy. I would speak only to this effect. This is an equal opportunity commission. The former commissioner who served for three years certainly is familiar with that operation and as is the Director. Both are no longer there and yet both would take the trouble to ask that this legislature
