PRESIDENT: All right, are these the amendments to the bill, Senator Marsh. Senator Carpenter, you had your light on, did you want to speak. All right those in favor, any further discussion. All those in favor of adopting the committee amendments vote aye, those opposed vote no. It requires 25 votes. Senator Barnett. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, Mr. President. Then..

PRESIDENT: Committee amendments are adopted.

CLERK: There are no other amendments.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Speaker, I move for the advancement of 1048. This is a piece of legislation which will help facilitate the building projects in the state of Nebraska. As I'm sure you are all aware, the state will continue to be a prime customer for construction activities. We need a way to efficiently supervise the buildings so that they will be built on time and with the administrators being held accountable for the expectations of the various projects. I move for the advancement of 1048.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: May I ask the Senator a question. Does this apply to all public projects, or just buildings.

SENATOR MARSH: This applies to buildings.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Only buildings?

SENATOR MARSH: Capital construction projects.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well would that apply to Public Power Districts, and capital construction.

SENATOR MARSH: That's the...not the intent, as I understand it.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Yes, but does the bill do that. I think...

SENATOR MARSH: No...this will...for instance on Parks and Games Projects, some of these have gone on for six years when we have appropriated the money. We would like to see that the monies are spent the years they are appropriated for the purposes for which they were appropriated. For instance, the state lab building, it took six years to start after the original appropriations. So each year, then we have to reappropriate some monies. They ar....

SENATOR CARPENTER: All I'm suggesting, Senator is that you make sure you are not doing what I think maybe a possibility.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Carpenter, I will double check and if that's so I will help do what needs to be done on Select File.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney and then Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Senator Marsh yield to a question.

SENATOR MARSH: Certainly.

SENATOR MAHONEY: What would the building administrator be paid. The salary be?
