PRESIDENT: This is Senator Moylan's amendment to the bill.

CLERK: Yes, and it simply reads, on page reinstates the ~~stricken~~ matter in lines 18 to 23, except furnished or to be furnished. Signed, Senator Moylan.

PRESIDENT: The question then is, shall the amendment to the bill be adopted. All those in favor say aye, those opposed say no. Vote. Voting on the amendment to the Moyland bill. The amendment requires 25 votes. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to go as Senator Moylan does and

PRESIDENT: I'm going to wait a moment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: O.K.

PRESIDENT: This is the amendment, the Moyland amendment to the Moylan bill. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 3 nays.

PRESIDENT: All right, the amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to indefinitely postpone LB642 Signed, Senator Clark.

PRESIDENT: Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: I'll take about two minutes on this. This is a perennial things that comes up every year. There is no problem is Nebraska. Senator, I'm very sorry that I have ...

PRESIDENT: Senator, I'm very sorry that I have ruled that two minutes is it. Except you have the right to make the motion. Now that's how I ruled Senator Chambers and Senator DeCamp's motion was ten minutes and that's the limit, and so we will have to put your motion to a vote. The motion is to indefinitely postpone LB642, all those in favor of indefinite postponement vote aye

CLERK: 19 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB642 is indefinitely postponed. Next bill is LB914 Now the Chair wants to make an announcement. I want to welcome all the visitors, and I don't have time to identify these various groups and I'm sorry about that, but you are welcome. Now, one other announcement. This has come and it already has. And that's the business of underlining bills.
