CLERK: Mr. President, there are two committee reports. There's one committee report that shows no committee amendments. Then there's another committee report that shows committee amendments by Senator Burbach. Was this before your committee twice?

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach, can you explain that?

SENATOR BURBACH: Would the Clerk please repeat what he just said here?

CLERK: Well, we have two committee reports. One shows no committee amendments and then another one shows....

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. You will recall this bill was heard before the Revenue Committee and it was advanced at the \$12 figure. And then it was ready to be discussed on the floor. Someone in this Body, I think it might have been Senator Carpenter wanted to alter the bill tremendously by doing away with the food tax, the tax on food completely without a refund. Senator Maresh at that time asked that it re....sent back and re-referred to the committee and it was referred to the committee and they're consequently were no amendments from the first hearing. From the second hearing, there was an amendment that our committee decided that \$13....the bill called for \$12 refund per each, per each individual that would apply for a tax credit or a refund. But our committee at that time discussed the possibility of \$14 but the determination of the committee was that this be increased from \$12 to \$13. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk, do you have the correct amendment? That's the one that makes the credit \$13, Senator Burbach?

SENATOR BURBACH: Thirteen.

PRESIDENT: All right now, you've heard the....this is a committee amendment, is that correct?

SENATOR BURBACH: That's correct.

PRESIDENT: Well, it doesn't make any difference, it's the amendment we're considering. All right, the discussion. Senator Burbach or the committee amendment. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. Chairman, I'd like to ask Senator Burbach what is the fiscal impact?

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach, Senator Nore is asking what the fiscal impact is.

SENATOR NORE: Approximately....approximately fiscal impact.

SENATOR BURBACH: Well, Senator Nore.....
