SENATOR MARVEL: Well, I guess the first motion, Mr. President, is to adopt the standing committee amendments and then I have another amendment to the bill. So.....

CLERK: Your other amendments are to the standing committee amendments though should be considered first.

SENATOR MARVEL: All right, read the other one now.

CLERK: The amendment is to.....in the committee amendment, page 919, line 38. (Clerk read corrected amendment). (Found on page 1476 of Journal).

SENATOR MARVEL: Now there is in escrow roughly \$183,000 which on Select File can be transferred over to this particular account. Meanwhile, this money can be used for the emergency that seems to have come up in the College of Agriculture. So I move the adoption of the amendment that I have to the committee amendment.

PRESIDENT: Did you have a question at this point, Senator Stahmer? This is the Marvel, all right, the Marvel amendment to the committee amendment. All those in favor say aye. Those opposed no. The amendment is adopted.

SENATOR MARVEL: Now the standing committee amendment, if you want to check your bill book simply spells out, Mr. President, the rest of it spells out the legal description of the land involved. So I move the adoption of the committee amendment as amended to LB938.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion on that? The question is, the adoption of the committee amendment. All those in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote no. This requires 25 votes. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Any further amendment?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel. Excuse me, Senator R. Lewis. What will you do with the bill?

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Advance it to E & R initial, please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I think this now is a good bill and it does several things which are important. I would hope that we could get this across.
