SPEAKER: Well Senator Mahoney, I understand your feelings. But I have got to try and treat everybody alike here.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Well Senator Fellman had a bill here just a little bit earlier and you let him go ahead and withdraw it.

SPEAKER: What bill?

SENATOR MAHONEY: Didn't you have one Senator Fellman earlier?

SPEAKER: Senator Fellman.

SENATOR FELLMAN: If I understand the question, the question was that Senator Mahoney was really raising is that whether he has the right to alter or offer substitutes for underlined bills?

SPEAKER: That is correct.

SENATOR FELLMAN: Now, I hate to do this Mr. Speaker, but you and I did some horse trading a few days ago and we did some swapping of bill numbers up there.

SPEAKER: Not with me you didn't horse trade, Senator. You asked me...this was a bill of switching of two bills which I explained this procedure to the body. I permitted two state Senators who had underlined or were sponsors to switch bills, is that not correct?

SENATOR FELLMAN: How is that different?

: IN allowing one state Senator to change a bill from his underlined to another one?

SPEAKER: I have already thought about that. It does not change it a great deal, but the question here is that Senator DeCamp moved that we would only consider underlined bills, and the only bills underlined before us at the time of his motion were those on the worksheet. That is how it differs and I believe that was a switch of bills of underlined bills, was it not?

SENATOR FELLMAN: You are correct, that was a switch in position of two bills that were underlined.

SPEAKER: Now the attempt has been made here to bring bills from the bottom or the middle part of a nonunderlined list into the underlined list and that is a difference, a very distinct difference. Because you change their order. Alright Senator Mahoney has moved to overrule the chair. Let me explain what the Chair ruled. The Chair ruled that since we had begun the discussion of 731, and underlined bill, that we would continue with the discussion to a conclusion whether the bill lived or died. Now Senator Mahoney wanted me to drop that immediately to the bottom of General File. I ruled that we would finish the discussion. The question is now, shall the chair be overruled. Does everybody understand this?
