

SENATOR DE CAMP: The other amendment that I have up there is next.

SPEAKER: Still in it but...

SENATOR SYAS: I can't vote for this until you take that one out. I'm not going to take any chances, because I know what you are trying to do.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Very well, the amendment is in there that we redistribute the money if you will, just a moment.....onpage 8 beginning with line 19, Senator Syas, the amendment to which you object is in there. This calls for redistribution of the money, based upon the way it was prior to the time that Senator Stahmer redistributed it once before.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion? Now as I understand it this is the committee amendment to the bill. There are no other amendments on it at this time. All those in favor of the committee.....Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: (no reponse)

SPEAKER: All in favor of adopting the committee amendments vote aye, those opposed vote no. This requires 25 votes. Have you all voted? If you are going to vote, please do so. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 7 nays.

SPEAKER: Committee amendments are adopted. What is on the Clerk's desk?

CLERK: Read DeCamp amendment.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, this is a problem that Senator Syas is concerned about. My main purpose of the whole school lands bill was to go back to the old formula of distribution of the school lands money which was in effect prior to 1971 when Senator Stahmer successfully changed it because we probably didn't know what we were voting on here, but in order to get the rest of the bill through which is now simply administrative procedures to legitimize the increased rent and other administrative procedures the boards of lands and funds have adopted, I agreed to take out this part of the bill, which is really the only part I had left in the bill. So I move the adoption of the amendments, reluctantly.

SPEAKER: Any further discussion of the DeCamp amendment. If not are you ready for the question? Question is shall the DeCamp amendment to the bill be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. This requires 25 votes. We are voting on the DeCamp amendment to the bill. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? We are now going to call for the vote. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, I call for a call of the house, even I can happily see that it isn't passing.

SPEAKER: Clerk will please clear the board. Senator DeCamp has moved for a call of the house those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.
