

But from the time that we leave here Wednesday night until say that we would, possibly, and this is only a possibility that we would adjourn until say 3:00 Friday afternoon, or pardon me, 3:00 Thursday afternoon, that would constitute the day that we could override vetos or let bills remain and put in the 60th day. I'm not interested in that next part of next week. I'm only interested in Saturday so I'm not going to get into that argument. Lets just settle we do need a Saturday morning in order to move the bills that we already have on Select File and those that we are so rapidly moving through and so I would like to have your pleasure by asking the Clerk to take a motion from me that if we have and you would indicate by your vote, we have 25 people or more who would be willing to come Saturday morning and work on these bills.

SPEAKER: Chair recognizes the Chairman of the appropriations committee, Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: I don't know whether the Clerk can answer this question or the Speaker without bringing Emory up, I would point out to you and Senator Mahoney I'm not talking against your amendment or motion, I'm just simply calling this to the attention of the legislature. The crucial well every bill is crucial but 1054 which is on E & R for engrossment is a crucial bill and I would like to know if we meet Saturday whether it is possible that we act on that bill and move it back so that it can be engrossed. The other crucial bill I should assume is 1055 which is Capital Construction bill, 1056, and 1058 should not require too much debate and 1049 a is the claims bill. But the key bill is 1054. Now the first question that I think ought to be answered, if we meet Saturday, and I can't be here in the morning, but whenever you meet, can we act on 1054 so that it can be moved and can be properly engrossed. I realize that there are motions up there to bring 1054 back to Select File, if there are a lot of these we are in deep trouble and every passing 1054. I would like some sort of reaction to what we actually can do on appropriations bills if we meet Saturday and if we meet Monday. The other issue Mr. President, and members of the legislature and Senator Mahoney has already touched on this if we decide that we want to have extra time for overriding vetoes, then I would assume that
