

SENATOR MARVEL: OK, now my question is that the next time we meet and use up a day, what we do to...I'm basically interested in Emory in 1054 and then 1055 which is on Select File, and the debate hasn't finished. Lets assume that we meet Saturday and 1054 is back on Select File to adopt the E & R amendments, as long as there isn't any debate then there is no problem with that bill. If there is debate and that bill is held up on Saturday, then we are in trouble.

MR. BURNETT: If there are any further amendments other than E & R amendments to 1054 it can not be reported to Final READING Saturday unless you adopt those amendments today.

SENATOR MARVEL: Well what is the status of....lets assume that we meet Saturday. What is the status if we do not advance that bill, if it isn't engrossed Saturday, then when could we vote on it?

MR. BURNETT: 1054? If you meet Saturday and 1054 is not engrossed on that day, the earliest that you could vote on it would be the 60th legislative day which ever day that might be.

SENATOR MARVEL: OK, that clears....

MR. BURNETT: It could then only be reported in the 58th it would have to lay over under the constitution the 59th and could only be voted upon then on the 60th.

SENATOR MARVEL: Well so, in other words, what we have to do if there is any chance of overriding the veto, the next time we meet we have too, during that legislative day, we have to see that those budget bills or whatever other bills that we are talking about those bills have to be engrossed. The next day we meet, that is what you are really saying.

MR. BURNETT: That is correct Senator.

SENATOR MARVEL: Senator Mahoney, I'm sorry, but I question whether we can meet Saturday.

SPEAKER: Chairman of Rules Committee, Senator Duis. Well Emory....

SENATOR DUIS: Emory if I might ask the question, I think that we are really concerned about the budget bills because they are of a grave necessity and I realize that all of the rest of the bills are gravely important to each and everyone of us, Separately but 1055 what is the position of that in engrossing and being passed this session? We have got about 20 amendments up there I understand for it and if that gets to bouncing around, do we stand a chance of loosing the bill for the entire session? If it takes us over the next legislative day to advance it to E & R.

MR. BURNETT: If you do not get it advanced to E & R on the 57th, day, you would stand a chance of loosing it Senator.

SENATOR DUIS: Thank you sir, that is what I told the other day here and I'm sure sorry but this is a real bare fact.
