PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. Are there any further amendments.

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: What do you do with the bill, Senator Snyder.

SENATOR SNEYER: Mr. President, I move that LB1026 as amended be advanced to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT: Do you feel that you have sufficiently explained it? All right, any further discussion? Question is, to advance the bill as amended. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes on the motion to advance, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB677 Senator Kelly's bill. Clerk will read.

CLERK: LB677 Title read Amendment offered by Senator Goodrich On line 8, Pg. 4 of white copy by inserting "upon request of the Sect. of State" before the word mail.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President and members of the body. This white copy that is referred to in my motion is the Kelly amendment to the bill, which possibly we should take Kelly's amendment first so that I can then amend his motion, so I would defer to Senator Kelly for his amendment first.

PRESIDENT: Well, are you amending Senator Kelly's amendment or are...

SENATOR GOODRICH: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Or to proceed with his amendment and then take up your amendment.

SENATOR GOODRICH: We should adopt his first, and then adopt mine.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Kelly let's proceed to your amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, may I inquire what the white copy means. We only have the one copy.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly. The question is what is the question. The Clerk is asking what the white copy means. Whatever that means.

CLERK: I have two separate amendments that refer to a white copy And there isn't...the only amendment...the only copy being amended is the bill.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk do you have amendments before you?

CLERK: I have some amendments offered by Kelly, and some amendments offered by Cavanaugh.
