Point is, if you have ...or if you had put your amendment to the amendment it would take a majority vote, you elected to go the other way, this takes 25 votes, because we already adopted the other amendment. And I'm going to call for the vote.

SENATOR GOODRICH: The Secretary of State asked for me to do this. Is all that I can say.

PRESIDENT: Well, the Secretary of State was advising, he should have moved a call of the....Clerk will record. Senator Goodrich for what purpose do you rise.
