and it is not an emergency. And we ought to have plenty of time to go through that problem here in the Legislature. I would urge you to support Senator Maresh in this kill motion. I think it's ridiculous we even stand here and consider this I'd be happy to show in detail to any one that would like to get involved in this subject, and I sure hope that these abandoned railroad properties that are abandoned, and that the person involved with property adjoining have an opportunity to take back that land and do something constructive with the land, rather than keep it separated so that we cannot irrigate, we cannot produce. I'm sure that if you will just take a little consideration you certainly will kill this bill, without a question. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Time limit, has just expired. Motion is to indefinitely postpone the bill. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote no. The motion is to indefinitely postpone by Senator Maresh. Have you all voted? For the last time, have you all voted. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 11 nays.

PRESIDENT: The bill is indefinitely postponed. Next bill is LB651.

CLERK: LB651 Title read. This bill was placed on General File after the committee had indefinitely postponed it. Accordingly there are no committee amendments. There are other amendments. Some offered by Senator Waldron and some offered by Senator DeCamp.

PRESIDENT: I believe the introducer has the right to take up his amendments first, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, and members of the Legislature. My amendments make the bill so it pulls Nebraska out of winter daylight savings time next winter. It wouldn't have any affect until next winter, but at that time when we adopt the amendments and hopefully advance the bill it would bring Nebraska, the entire state just on our conventional time next winter. And I move adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I have a question of Senator DeCamp. Does this also take western Nebraska out of it during the winter time.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, Sir. This is not the old bill, this is just to take Nebraska. The State of Nebraska.

SENATOR WHITNEY: This is an amendment now to the old bill. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: All right, are you ready for the question? Senator Keyes. Senator passes. The question is, shall the DeCamp amendment be adopted. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, no nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: DeCamp amendment is adopted. Then what's the next amendment, Mr. Clerk?
