SENATOR LUEDTKE: I understand there is an amendment to take them out of the bill, so I would.

SENATOR CLARK: I think Senator Stull, has the amendment, but he isn't here.

SENATOR LEUDTKE: No, there is another amendment, that I saw. I just checked on it. There is an amendment to take them out and I would not oppose that amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: I think he also has an amendment to take this cost of living increase out.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, we have...there is an amendment by Senator Schmit on that, which..which. I wish we would adopt this, and then we can. This deals with the technical changes. Let's adopt this and go to the other amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, Mr. President, I'd like to ask Senator Luedtke a question. Senator Luedtke, to the employees of the state who are making four, five, six seven or eight, nine ten thousand dollars a year. Did you vote to give them a cost of living raise.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I..we...we...

SENATOR KEYES: We..we.. not we..I mean you personally.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I didn't on your bill, but

SENATOR KEYES: All right, thank you.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, let me answer your question though.

SENATOR KEYES: That's all I wanted to know, Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LEUDTKE: This matter came up..

SENATOR KEYES: That's all I wanted to know.

PRESIDENT: You can finish your answer, Senator I'm getting a little bit edgy.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, he asked a question, I think I ought to get a chance to answer it.

PRESIDENT: I do to. Go on reconsideration. Go ahead and answer him. He doesn't have to listen, but go ahead. All right. The question is, the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. The question is, shall the committee amendments be adopted. This requires 25 votes. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendments are adopted. Any further amendments, Mr. Clerk: Yes, Mr. President, I move to strike section 3 Signed, Senator Schmit.
