PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh has heard for the adoption of the E & R amendments on LB302. All those in favor of the E & R amendments say aye, all those in favor say aye, those opposed no. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are some other amendments pending on this one, and it is on it's way up. Senator Marvel offers some amendments to LB302 which are found on page 1088 of the Legislative Journal. Page 1088 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: Can I ask, and see if it's possible to pass over 302 until Monday.

PRESIDENT: Pass it over. Read the next bill. Somebody objects to that. To passing that over. Senator Stahmer do you object. All right, it's passed over.

CLERK: Mr. President, 782, I have a motion to return it to General File and place it first, Signed Senator Stahmer.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: What question is that.

CLERK: You want to return 782 to General File.

SENATOR STAHMER: No, no. no. I don't want that now.

CLERK: What do you want to do then...

SENATOR STAHMER: Bracket it.

PRESIDENT: Well, is there any objection to bracketing it?

CLERK: 782, this was a bill that was....

PRESIDENT: Well, there is an objection to bracketing it. Do you want to move it?

CLERK: The bill had been to Final Reading and was returned to Select File to strike enacting clause. That motion lost, and then it failed to advance.

SENATOR STAHMER: I ask unanimous consent to take off my amendment. These people think it's got lights, and boy they must believe in angels.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn. All right, Senator Stahmer. Any further amendments on the bill, Mr. Clerk. All right, what do you want to do with the bill.

CLERK: LB982, then Mr. President 982, Mr. President, there are E & R amendments. There are E & R amendments on 982.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move the adoption of the amendments to 982.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion on the adoption of the E & R amendments, I believe, is that correct. All right. All those in favor of the E & R amendments say aye. Those opposed no. They are adopted.
