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to rent something at a certain price. At the market price, you have to maintain your product. Now Senator Whitney played this game of deception by using words like 'condinium and apartments' if we are going to build condominiums and apartments on school land, because he knows and some of the people in here to that I build apartments and condominiums, so he's trying to create a false impression there. But the money would be used for, it would come out of the rental money, and it would be used to maintain the land. This is exactly the same procedure that this Legislature is adopted in irrigation district funds, I guess to it's the Ainsworth Project and things like this. And it's not unconstitutional. And if he..what the Attorney General said in his opinion was, that it is unconstitutional, so the Legislature says, you can do this. Well the Legislature hasn't said it up to this point, so that's why I want this provision in the law. Now the bill isn't going to live or die on this provision alone. It's important, but the rest of the bill will live or die, whether...I mean it's vital important that we adopt the rest of the bill, if you want to keep the rental income coming from these lands. On this particular amendment I would repeat, all it does is establish that out of the rental income which is now twice as much almost this year as it has been in the past. They would use 10% to maintain and keep the lands in condition so they can keep renting them at high prices. That's all it does. So I urge the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: O.K. next to speak is Senator Schmit and then Senator Burbach. We are debating now the DeCamp amendment. To LB894 on Select File.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I'll be very brief.

PRESIDENT: All right, now wait a minute, let's make sure. To clarify something here. He has combined a previous objection.. Excuse me..he had another amendment this morning and he has now combined that with something that he added to it.

CLERK: The amendment now would read, Mr. President, Strike the Whitney amendment and then add this new section of appropriating the money.

PRESIDENT: That's the amendment before us.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I rise in support of the DeCamp amendment. I rise for this reason and this reason only. The Committee on Agriculture and Environment heard this bill. The first hearing we held was a very conclusive hearing. And the members of the committee were as confused I'm sure as you are here today about the value of the bill. Therefore, we scheduled a second hearing. We did what Senator DeCamp has explained. We took care of those technical problems that existed in the present law, and we did it what we thought with a fine tooth comb. We did do one additional thing which was knocked out. We readjusted the distribution formula, but Senator Syas very definitely pointed that out and that part was taken out of the bill. So that the bill as it is today is a clean bill. Now if you have any confidence in the committee system. Vote for the DeCamp amendment and support the bill. The bill is a necessary bill. We need it. It does not do those things that Senator Warner...it is not guilty of those things that Senator Whitney has described it to be guilty of, and I hope you will support the DeCamp amendment, and pass
