SENATOR MURPHY: A question of Senator Stahmer.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer yield.

SENATOR STAHMER: Yes, Sir.

SENATOR MURPHY: Senator, I wonder if you are corrective amendments included the change in 15 and 16 were we have two effective dates.

SENATOR STAHMER: I'll have to check. I think that if they haven't. That possibly if you would include them, if we are going to clean up some of the confusion. Mine presently reads that in section 15 the operative date will be July 1, 74 and the next section says the operative date will be affective as an emergency clause.

SENATOR MURPHY: Senator, I was looking at that emergency clause, and I'm wondering if that wasn't something that the Health Committee put on, when they voted that bill out.

SENATOR STAHMER: I have no idea who put it on Senator, it's just to me more confusion though. Well let me. I think if we leave it in and makes it affective with the emergency clause that will erase the other problem. If it is a problem that when the bill comes up on Final Reading, I'll urge that the emergency clause be stricken. If that's alright with you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cal Carsten.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I would like to ask Senator Stahmer a question if he will yield.

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer yield

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: Senator Stahmer, I was informed earlier on the discussion of 302 that there was going to be an amendment submitted that would provide for a board to contract for services outside their district, and I'm a little concerned as to whether this is included in any of these amendments. Could you answer that?

SENATOR STAHMER: Well, the provisions as far as I know them allow for the. Yes, for one district to contract with another. And also for one district to allow receipt of individuals from the second district where would be to that advantage of the person living in the second district to..in other words there might be services closer in the other district, so both of those -provisions are contained in this bill. This allows flexibility not only between districts, but between individuals in one district with a second district.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: It's specifically spelled out in here. You are sure.

SENATOR STAHMER: Absolutely.

SENATOR CAL CARSTEN: O.K. Thank you.
