And we just can't stand here and talk about rehabilitation of a person who is in the county jail, I don't care what the county jail is. What are you going to rehabilitate in such a short period of time. So again, I would urge that. I'm not going to make a kill motion on this bill. Senator Fellman and I have discussed it among ourselves. He knew that I was going to be opposing his move. I would just hope that 792 would remain on Select File. If the Judiciary Committee is sincere, and I'm certainly not against corrections reform. But if the Judiciary Committee feels that there is a need for this, I would invite the committee come back with a report next year. Substantiating the arguments for this. But let's not just single out one county, especially when there was no wide spread call of alarm by anyone of the counties that I know of saying that this had to be done immediately. Their argument was, that it will take care of some things regarding city-county merger. As it was done in Day County last year. I would remind Senator Fellman that that argument really isn't valid because Day county, of course has city-county merger, whereas Douglas County does not.
