PRESIDENT: The question is, shall LB782 be advanced from Select File. All those in favor will vote aye. All those opposed will vote no. Motion is to advance LB782 from Select File as amended. Once again, the Chair is going to ask if you have all voted?

CLERK: Mr. President, it's to advance it to Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: Excuse me, the question is to advance it to Final Reading. That's correct. The Chair stands corrected. Advance from Select File to Final Reading. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 11 nays, on the motion to advance to Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: Okay. LB782 is advanced. We'll move on to the Select File consideration of LB774.

CLERK: LB774, Mr. President, has E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move the adoption of E & R amendments to LB774.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB774. All those in favor of the motion, say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, there is a motion to indefinitely postpone LB774. Signed, Senator Mahoney.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Mahoney for his motion to indefinitely postpone LB774.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Real brief, Mr. President. I think that this bill does not meet the requirements of the people in Lancaster County, to the county that is directly to the south of me. I don't think that we have any particular business telling these counties of smaller size what their county attorneys should do on a fulltime or parttime basis. And so I ask that this bill be indefinitely postponed. It would be a bill that I think we could take off of that board and nothing is going to make that much difference in the next year.

PRESIDENT: Going to change the board to LB774, please. Thank you. Now, Senator Syas. Then Senator Stromer. Stand by.

SENATOR SYAS: Well, I was here when we passed it for Douglas County and boy, if there's anybody resisting with all of these people that have private practice and had a county salary too. And what they were doing at that time and I'll bet that they're doing it in these other counties. Their law firm would have one side of the case and the county attorney would have the other. And it was a very convenient
