PRESIDENT: Motion before us is Senator Simpson's amendment to 774. Senator Nore.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. President, members, I would favor the simpson amendment. I think that it is good to have a built in incentive to do well. Usually when you are on a salary you don't have that built in incentive. I'm talking about the free enterprize profit incentive motive. Usually when you are on the salary you become rather inactive and parkensis law takes ahold and you soon have deputies coming out of your ears, and you become rather lazy and inactive. The peace work basis of work, peace work is always more productive because of that built in incentive to do well. When you are on a salary you don't have the incentive. Usually you get someone who can't make a living on his own you don't get the expertise and I think that it is good for these lawyers to pass this work around for the trying to pass this work around and give two lawyers who have experience and expertise and the practice. So for....I think that you are sort of going to have a sleepy inactive county attorney office when you put them on a salary for on a piece work basis why you are going to have someone who is ative.

PRESIDENT: Chair next recognizes Senator Keyes. We are speaking on the Simpson amendment Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. President, members, I certainly am not going to oppose Lancaster County wanting out. I talked to everyone of the Lancaster County Senators until this one man that is running for the office got ahold of them and they all told me that they were in favor of the bill if the salary was \$32,500 and I supported that. Now I am rather sorry that I put this on Senator Stromer's bill because Senator has made a big issue of 98 counties, I believe that it is or 93, but if he would just go and check how many counties are over 20,000 he would find that you can probably number the counties on both hands for the counties that are over 20,000 and that would leave almost 80, 75 counties under 20,000 population that this bill does not concern at all. This is the bill that concerns counties of a lot of population and a great deal of evaluation and a lot of work for a county attorney and he certainly needs full time.

PRESIDENT: Next to speak is Senator Syas, and Senator Fowler.

SENATOR SYAS: Well the holy city wants out. And the bar association as I said a while ago took no action. I am opposed to letting Lancaster out of this bill just because some Senators in Lancaster County wanted out of this bill. I remember some other bills this session where I didn't want Lancaster County to interfere with me and that will probably be the charge now, but they did so anyhow and they thought nothing of that, and now I don't know what I think that if they will take a good look, the people of Lancaster County deserves full time accountings without...a...a... private practice. I am surprised that the attorneys in this body wouldn't desire a county attorney and a judge and all
