

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well, I think that the bill is dead. I apologize to Sarpy, Lancaster counties, I was trying to help out there people and interruding into their domain and I think that we will keep the same system and the people of Lancaster County and Sarpy County can be adequately served until I think that they find that they have a problem, that I think that I know already exists. This amendment would hopefully pick up a few more amendments or I mean votes. I really don't think that it makes much difference, I think that you should adopt the amendment, I don't think that any county attorney or counties of that size should have private practice it does not serve the people but I'm afraid that is the way it is going to be.

PRESIDENT: Question is do you want to adopt the Cavanaugh amendment as proposed. All those in favor of that amendment vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Once again, have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 24 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion is lost. Are there other...

CLERK: Read motion to indefinitely postpone the bill.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Skarda for his motion to indefinitely postpone 774.

SENATOR SKARDA: Mr. President, members of the body, it seems as though this bill has been hashed long enough. Now we have something that I think should be laid to rest. Sarpy County commissioners are against the bill. I have talked to them personally and Lancaster is dissatisfied and the rates are stricken from the bill I can't
