

SENATOR MARVEL: I think that before we take this vote we need to consider whether or not in the process of voting to meet tomorrow whether we are willing to reserve one day for next week so that we can come back and review the governors work to determine whether we want to override the veto or not. I think that the... let me say this. My motion up there assuming that E & R had to work tomorrow my motion was that we adjourn until Wednesday that we work Wednesday and Thursday of this week and then adjourn and meet Thursday of next week to allow the Governor time to adequately review what he wants to do with our work so that we can come back here and determine what we want to do with what he did. I think that when we vote on Tuesday, whether we meet on Tuesday will have something to do with what we do next week.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I think that Senator Marvel that would be correct if we had loads of work for E & R. But at the present time Mr. Burnett can handle what we have got and I have talked to the Governor as of last Wednesday and he said that if we could have those bills to him in one day that he would send them back here the next day, those that he wanted to veto. I don't know why we would want to go back into another week and hold the thing over. I think that it is a very good possibility that if we vote tomorrow we can finish this session this week, and I think that is what we ought to try and do.

SENATOR MARVEL: Alright, Mr. President.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, Senator Marvel I think that we could answer this question tomorrow if you want too. I think that we ought to decide today if we are going to work tomorrow. That is the only question that we have before us. I think that your problem of waiting for the next week, we can resolve tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: Now stand by, we have several lights on here. Senator Whitney.

SENATOR WHITNEY: That is exactly right Mr. President, and thank you for pointing it out. I want to meet tomorrow and I want to meet continuing this week and then quit. It is our responsibility to get as much done as we can and it is the Governor's responsibility from there on. If he vetoes something that we don't like that is his responsibility. It seems to me. I think that we ought to go ahead like we are and meet tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: The Chair, just a minute here, Senator Warner before you... Alright, the Chair has mis-spoken it does not involve what we do the rest of today, a on Select File. The motion is only to indicate or to find somebody support as to the direction we should go and shall the legislature meet tomorrow? Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: My only question was Vince, did Emory indicate that if there was quite a bit of activity on some of these bills yet today that that would not perhaps cause a problem?
