

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, members of the legislature I would not like to meet tomorrow. I would like to have our staff members have all the time that they need to get the legislation that we have already taken to them in the proper form so that we are not constantly juggling when we do return to have it in the form where it will stay on its way toward final reading. Lets not meet tomorrow, lets meet Wednesday and Thursday at the conclusion of todays business.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I think what Senator Snyder is trying to do now is similar to what President Nixon wanted to do after he got caught not paying his taxes. He said that he would pay them. After they are caught, everyone will pay. The essence of that particular amendment was the skipping of the day and then we would meet from this day forward and not the time that we would adjourn today. I think that since the essence of the motion was understood and had to do with time subsequent to today the motion was put and it was defeated. I think that the only way that it can be voted upon again is to have somebody on the prevailing side move to reconsider it. Senator Snyder lost. He ought to be gracious about it. I presume that he lost. Here is what I want to say anyway. I have antagonized a couple of Senators by referring to myself as a prophet in terms of telling how the legislature is going to back off of every motion and passes when it tries to bind us into several days in the future. I'll make another prediction that I have already said that when you all voted the other time that you were not going to stick by it that was on Carpenter's motion then somebody else, I think Senator Whitney tried to change that one to bind us in the future and that is about to be changed now and if we adopt Senator Marvel's motion today you all know as well as I do that as soon as we get 25 votes we can change anything that has been done. I have a recommendation when we will adjourn now. Why don't we take it a day at a time. Why don't we decide after today when we are going to meet again. We don't have to pile up days after days and work all of these different formulas because no day do we come back to work and do what we anticipated the day before what we would do. We know that the legislature is going to bogged down. We know the nature of this body's operation. So what I would recommend and I'm not going to put it to a vote is that each day comes and some of us may not be here is that somebody in his infinite wisdom decides to let us rest from our labors those of us will be here can vote on when we will be here again. That is what I would recommend so even before a motion is made now to determine when we will meet again, that particular comment should be incorporated in a motion to adjourn for the day. That is my suggestion.

PRESIDENT: Alright, the motion before the house as the Chair understands it, it was made by Senator Mahoney a that we meet at 9:00 tomorrow when we adjourn today. Now then that is the question before the house. We could debate this I think all night. The question is when you adjourn today do you want to meet tomorrow at 9:00? If so vote aye, if not
