SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Okay. Do we have two sets of plans then, is that the situation?

SENATOR STAHLER: Not complete working ones. They've got sketches and I honestly think they can get the buildings built faster if they go to a simple plan. The children will be in buildings faster if they go to a simple plan.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: How much did we pay for these plans?

SENATOR STAHLER: I would guess maybe \$50,000, I'm not sure.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator Carstens, do you know that?

PRESIDENT: Senator Carstens, Senator Cavanaugh has a question for you. Senator Carstens, Senator Cavanaugh has a question for you. Do you know the cost of the plans?

SENATOR CARSTENS: Well, I don't know the cost of the plans. Somebody on the Appropriations Committee, I think, if I'm wrong, I stand corrected, but I think the appropriation is around a million dollars.

PRESIDENT: Now, wait a minute, just a minute. Senator Stahlmer, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Well, I...if he....

SENATOR STAHLER: Again, to answer your question, these plans were bid once and they ran 35% over the estimate and basically it's being rebid with the same design.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: This plan that Senator Carstens is defending?

SENATOR STAHLER: They were bid and they went 35% over our estimates. And now they're trying to cheapen it and still keep the same room design. And I just don't think you can cheapen it that much, 35% is...you just can't do it, I don't think.
