CLERK: 25 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on motion to return.

PRESIDENT: All right, LB1056 is returned to Select File.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, the motion is to adopt the specific amendment. Signed, Senator Carstens.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Carstens.

SENATOR CARSTENS: I have no....I think it's all been gone over. I have nothing further.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: I would like to draw....Mr. President... I would like to draw to this Body's attention that if we add this amendment now, we are closing our own option to override a gubernatorial veto on this piece of legislation. If we simply pass it back, then we have one day when we might have the option to override a veto.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp. Any further discussion? Question is then, do you want to adopt the specific amendment as outlined by Senator Fred Carstens? If you do, vote aye.

CLERK: They'd like to have the amendment read.

PRESIDENT: Let's read the amendment.

CLERK: Read amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on that? Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: I want to be of...be sure of one thing here, Vince. In that amendment on page 6, lines 18 and 20 are left in, aren't they? You don't reappropriate.....

CLERK: I have no reference to that. The only amendment I have is to strike the Stahmer amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator F. Carstens.

SENATOR MARVEL: I just want to double check it. If we take that out, Senator Carstens, we're in real trouble.

CLERK: Fiscal should coordinate with E & R then to make sure that's what happens.

PRESIDENT: Are you all through discussing the motion now? All right, the question is, do you want to adopt the specific amendment to LB1056 on Select File? If you do, vote aye. If not, vote no. Motion is to adopt the specific amendment. LB1056 on Select File. Once again, the Chair needs to know if you have all finished voting. Twenty-five, sir. What is your pleasure? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 15 nays, 8 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Amendment is adopted. Senator Carstens, what is your pleasure regarding the bill? Do you want to re-advance it?

SENATOR F. CARSTENS: I move the bill be returned to E & R for Engrossing.
