PRESIDENT: Motion is to suspend the rules and go direct to Select File. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President and members of the Legislature. I also agree with Senator Luedtke to go to Select File and like Senator Carpenter said, what has happened in the past is water over the dam and how we're going to handle ourselves in the future is water that has not yet reached the dam. So let's merely consider our problem of handling Select File and how to handle other problems that might surface in the future.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Chambers. Passing? All right. Senator Nore, the motion is to go direct to Select File.

SENATOR NORE: Mr. Chairman, members, I think on LB632, we should turn down all amendments and accept the Maresh bill and get on....

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore, that's not the issue before the Body. The motion is just to suspend the rules. I'm sorry. Senator Carpenter, do you want to be heard again? Your light is still on. Motion is to suspend the rules and go direct to Select File beginning with LB632.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, as I understand, we're really discussing LB632 to a limited extent, according to an amendment pending by Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Well, no, no, we haven't suspended the rules and gone to Select File here yet.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I know, but he's talking about an amendment he has up there. Is that right?

SENATOR CARPENTER: No response.

PRESIDENT: Well, he made a suggestion that there was involved in the suspension here. I suppose that if...well, LB632 is a part of Select File. That is the way I would rule but....

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, the only thing I'm trying to determine, to what extent does this affect the sales tax Omaha and Lincoln are now legally able to levy for their own purposes?

PRESIDENT: Can't answer that in this motion, I don't think Senator.

SENATOR CARPENTER: But he discussed it.

PRESIDENT: No, he was talking about the number of motions that were involved up here, Senator, is all. And the possibility of the withdrawal of some as the Chair heard the discussion.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, all I can say is that I'm opposed to doing anything with the mill....the sales tax that applies
