PRESIDENT: Stand by. Nothing to do with this motion, I don't think. Senator Warner, are you through discussing the issue? Okay. Senator Luedtke, any closing?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: No closing. Let's vote.

PRESIDENT: The question is, do you want to suspend the rules and go direct to Select File beginning with LB632. If you do vote aye. If not, vote no. Thirty votes are required to suspend the rules in this Body. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 6 nays.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The rules are suspended. We'll move on to LB632 on Select File.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, I have a motion on LB632. I move to suspend the rules and advance LB632 to E & R without any further amendments. Signed, Senator Maresh.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Maresh.

SENATOR MARESH: Mr. President and to be fair with Senator Warner since he is going to a funeral, I'll let him....I'll withdraw...not withdraw...but I'll postpone it until after his amendment. I do not wish to consider any more amendments after his but if he wishes to have his considered, I'll hold up my motion until after this is taken up.

PRESIDENT: All right, now...okay. The Clerk advises the Chair, Senator Maresh, that there are other amendments.

SENATOR MARESH: I'll try for my motion then. I'll not withdraw it. I'll let you take a vote on it.

CLERK: All right, the first motion pending, Mr. President, which should be (inaudible).....

PRESIDENT: Wait a minute, stand by, Senator Maresh....you want to take your motion up right now, right?

CLERK: Warner's motion to amend is still pending.

PRESIDENT: That's correct. I think your motion then is going to have to be to suspend the rules and continue discussion then of the Warner amendment because that's before the Body, Senator Maresh.
