CLERK: 30 ayes, Mr. President and 11 nays.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the rules are suspended and LB632 is advanced without further amendments. Now then, I think we're back to Senator Luedtke's motion which relates to the rest of the bills on Select File. Okay, we're on Select File. Thank you. Got it.

CLERK: LB1040. LB1040, Mr. President, does have E & R amendments that should be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke has moved for the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB1040. All those in favor of the adoption of the E & R amendments please say aye. Those opposed say no. So ordered. Amendments are adopted.

CLERK: All right, now Mr. President, the first amendment is an amendment offered by Senator Stahmer and Senator Luedtke.

PRESIDENT: All right, the Chair recognizes Senator Stahmer.

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, members of the Body. I move for the return or...correction, the adoption of this motion and I had it drafted by our fiscal staff and Senator Luedtke agreed to it in essence. It would give us some money to begin planning and design for buildings as deemed necessary and programs, buildings and programs as deemed necessary by the LEAA and the corrections people. And for whatever they come up with. I hope it's the right thing. I for one don't want to be accused of trying to roadblock progress in the state. I move for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Question is, do you want to adopt the Stahmer-Luedtke amendment. If you do, vote aye. If not, vote no. Voting to adopt the Stahmer-Luedtke amendment to LB1040 on Select File. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Motion is adopted. Amendment is adopted. What other amendments do we have to the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is offered by Senator Stahmer and it says in the Barnett amendment, which I'm not sure what that refers to because there's not a Barnett amendment.

SENATOR STAHMER: I ask unanimous consent to withdraw that motion.

PRESIDENT: So ordered.

CLERK: There are no further amendments, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Luedtke's motion now is to advance LB1040 as amended. Is there need for further discussion? Question is, shall the bill be advanced? All those in favor of
