

notified a week ahead of time as to when the forms should be filed and wherever the office might be. I move for the adoption.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion? Senator Simpson.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Would Senator Carpenter yield to a question please? Senator Carpenter, you say one week before, that timing seems rather short to me that maybe it should be at least two weeks.

PRESIDENT: Senator Carpenter.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well you get into the final days of the campaign and then I would presume that the shortness might be desirable because otherwise a candidate if he so desires could have the right to correlate or to pile on whatever he wanted to do. I only want to be notified as a candidate what I have to do. The time is immaterial to me.

SENATOR SIMPSON: I was thinking in the time that getting the form if they send it out a week ahead of time of when it was due, you might really be in a rush to get that form back in a weeks time. The way the mails go now.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I'm willing to accept any amendment I'm only trying to do the obvious thing to see that we are all notified.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, I would move to amend that from one to two weeks.

SENATOR CARPENTER: I have no objections.

PRESIDENT: If he has no objections we will just tack it on there. Now the motion is to amend the forms be send out one-to two weeks. The question is do you want to adopt the Carpenter amendment? All those in favor of adopting the amendment will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Adopting the Carpenter amendment. To 677. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: OK, the amendment is adopted. Are there further amendments now to the bill?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Alright. What is your pleasure regarding the bill. Senator Kelly.
