PRESIDENT: Legislature please come to order. We will have roll call. Roll call. Please indicate your presence. Have you all indicated your presence.

CLERK: Senator Marvel asked to be excused until 2:30, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Are there objections to his absence. Hearing none so ordered. He is excused until 2:30. Have you all indicated your presence. Thank you. The Clerk will record.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Wiltse do you care to respond.

SENATOR WILTSE: Senator Carpenter, the motive is this. You get 774 and 1056 past, advanced and then go to straight on to Final Reading.

SENATOR CARPENTER: And then what happens, for example, can they move bills from Final Reading back to Select File.

SENATOR WILTSE: That is not the intention.

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, do you want to make that a part of the motion?

SENATOR WILTSE: Do you think we will get out from this session or not?

SENATOR CARPENTER: Well, this is your idea not mine. I'm just trying to find out what you are trying to do.
