CLERK: I move to suspend the rules and prohibit permitting any roll call votes for the balance of the day, signed, Senator Stahmer. Then...

PRESIDENT: That's the issue before the house. Do you support the motion, vote aye. If not, vote no. Senator Carpenter is asking for a record vote. Have you all voted on the issue. Clerk will record.

CLERK: voting aye 34, voting no 9, not voting 0

PRESIDENT: That's correct, Sir.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: When is the motion to adjourn out of order.

PRESIDENT: Never.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: How many times can the same members make the motion to adjourn. As many time...

PRESIDENT: I suppose as many times as...there is no rules in the book that say that it would limit that.. Unless they suspend the rules on that, right. All right, well how interesting.
