SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, may I have one minute besides indulging in the fact that I have to ask to overrule you?

PRESIDENT: Yes, go ahead.

SENATOR MAHONEY: I just have to remind my colleagues in the Legislature that the year is 1974. We are speaking about an area of four counties that have over, or close to, one third of the population of the entire State and these four counties, Douglas County with 450,000 to 500,000 people, we do not have in the year 1974 even the beginnings of a trade school, of a voc tech school for a city this size. I beg and implore upon you to overrule the Chair and let us get started with just the very, very minimal plans.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the Chair be overruled? If you want to overrule the Chair, vote aye; if not, vote nay. Once again, the question is shall the Chair be overruled? I have ruled that the Mahoney amendment to LB 94 is out of order and it is not germane to the original issue of LB 94. The question is shall the Chair be overruled? Once again, the Chair would inquire if you have all voted. There has been an issue for a call of the House. The Clerk will clear the board. Once again, at the next bell indicate your support of a call of the House. Motion is for a call of the House on a challenge of the Chair. Once again, have you all voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: Seventeen ayes, ten nays.

PRESIDENT: We are now under a call of the House. At the next bell then, please indicate your presence. Thank you. Now, Senator Fowler voting aye on overruling the Chair. Senator Fred Carstens voting aye on overruling the Chair. Have you all voted? Senator Stull voting aye. Senator Nore, we are under a call of the House. Delay that call.
