I would like to know, maybe it is on a point of personal privilege but do the bills on E & R engrossing have to be reported back in to take action on this year and where are they, what is the situation that those bills are in right now?

PRESIDENT: Well you have got a very good question and we don't know.

SENATOR BARNETT: That is what I am trying to find out before we take up adjournment.

PRESIDENT: Again you are correct and we don't know. There is no way in which we can keep track of that and handle the business that is going on over here this afternoon. Alright, we don't know what is up. Are you all through, Senator Whitney, did you want to discuss this motion to return LB938 for a specific amendment?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, I move that we adjourn.

PRESIDENT: Wait a minute, Senator Burbach has a question. Just a minute Senator Burbach?

SENATOR BURBACH: Those bills that we have there, 933 and on, are they absolutely completed or do we have to come back for the E & R amendments? If they are not, they are dead.

CLERK: What you have to come back for is to get, is to accept the reports if they are correctly engrossed. And if there are,

SENATOR BURBACH: That has to be done today if we want to pass them in 1974, is that right?

PRESIDENT: That is correct.

SENATOR BURBACH: Recess is the solution to our problem here.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Whitney what do you want to do with your motion? Senator Whitney has the floor. Senator Whitney?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Mr. President, I move we recess.

PRESIDENT: For how long and until when?

SENATOR WHITNEY: Just a moment, I would like to have the Clerk ask Emory Burnett. May I ask the Clerk for example, 302 has been brought back for E & R amendments. It has not. 7:30? I move we recess until 7:30 tonight.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to recess until 7:30. That is the motion before the House.

SENATOR WHITNEY: I would like to explain, everything has to be brought back and E & R amendments put on Final Reading, or we can not vote on it during this session of the Legislature. And therefore, we must recess, we must be able to come back and finish this up but I am going to, I think that we should wait until the Clerk has an explanation
