All those in favor of returning the bill vote aye. All those opposed vote no. The motion is to return LB678. You are voting on returning the bill only. Once again, have you all voted? Okay. Senator Stahmer. What is your pleasure?

SENATOR STAHMER: I ask for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: All right, the Clerk will clear the board. Senator Stahmer has asked for a Call of the House. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Motion is for a Call of the House. Got ya. We will have a record vote. Have you all voted? Clerk will record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 16 nays for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: We are under a Call of the House. Clear the board, at the next bell, indicate your presence so we can tell you who's here.

CLERK: Senator Johnson asked to be excused, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Pardon me.

CLERK: Senator Johnson asked to be excused.

PRESIDENT: So ordered. The motion under vote is to return LB678 and this is the motion to return the bill only to Select File for specific amendment and that is to strike the Chambers amendment. We are under Call of the House. Senator Stahmer. For what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR STAHMER: Mr. President, I did what I thought was right. I now move the Call be raised. It appears that no one wants to vote.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is, shall the Call be raised? All those in favor of raising the Call vote aye. All those opposed vote no. Thank you. Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, no nays, to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nore asked that the original vote be a record vote. Cancelling his request for a record vote.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion to return LB678 fails. What other business do we have on the desk?

CLERK: None.

PRESIDENT: Stand by.

CLERK: Mr. President, unanimous consent to bracket LB977 and LB977 on Final Reading. Signed, Senator Kennedy.
