

to make is that 3:00 is the time the Governor would be there. Now if the Legislature wants to meet at 9:00 tomorrow morning or 1:00 that is fine.

SENATOR WARNER: I understood your motion Senator Mahoney, was to meet at 3:00.

SENATOR MAHONEY: I'm sorry and I will reclarify it and I will then make it at 9:00 a.m. The reason for 9:00 a.m. is that we do have this other business to transact before we go sine die such as approving the resolutions for the interim study and some other business that is before us. So now I have changed my motion that we will meet at 9:00 a.m. and this is not a motion to adjourn now, this is to merely give the Governor that information if you choose to do this and if you vote this down we would come back next week.

PRESIDENT: I am going to assume that this is....it....this is not a motion to adjourn so we are going to debate the issue at least at this time because you are going to make a decision as to when you are going to meet so Senator Syas did you want to be heard on this issue? Senator Mahoney is proposing that when we adjourn today that we...

SENATOR SYAS: I want to ask a question, I don't want to create a controversy. But I thought that the Governor needed the time between the 9:00 and 3:00 because of these bills. That is the way I understood.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, he is now working on these bills, but he promises that his staff will stay up quite late tonight and they will be back at it in the morning. But he promises that by 3:00 he will have in this legislature all of the budget bills. We have other business that we would transact such as our Final Reading for the last day and other business that we would be doing such as interim study committees and approving those. Do you understand now Senator Syas?

PRESIDENT: Senator Stahmer, and then Senator Kelly.

SENATOR STAHMER: I think that Senator Mahoney just cleared up what I was going to ask. Go to Final Reading also tomorrow to clear up what we have on Final Reading, is that your understanding Senator Mahoney? Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, then Kelly.

SENATOR WARNER: One additional question for Senator Mahoney if he would yield. In your conversation are there other bills besides appropriation bills that might be vetoed?

SENATOR MAHONEY: He did not promise that he would be able to give any attention to the other bills that we send over.

SENATOR WARNER: In other words....

SENATOR MAHONEY: It would be just strictly the appropriation bills that we send over this morning, the general legislative appropriation bills.

SENATOR WARNER: Or bills passed this afternoon, the A bills would not be acted on either, right?
