ing the recess time until 1:30. By Senator Chambers motion. All
those in favor of that vote aye, all those opposed vote no. Simple
majority for a recess is all that is required. All right, are you
all through voting. Once again are you all through voting. All
right, Clerk will record. Motion is lost. The question now is do
you want to adjourn..excuse me... recess to 1:00. All those in favor
of recess until 1:00 vote aye, those opposed vote no. Thank you.
