SENATOR KELLY: Senator, I have a question in that same area. The Department of Revenue. Senator Hasebroock had an amendment, I believe it was \$400,000 requested by Bill Peters of the Revenue Department. I just don't get how they come in and need \$400,000. I'm sure that they put one of these bills, and then they will take it off back here again. And I want to get straight on that.

SENATOR MARVEL: O.K. Now, I think I have your question. Under the Revenue Administration. Under Program 106, which is the Energy Office Administration. This is the amendment that Senator Hasebroock offered. Is that right? \$325,000. So in answer to your question, he line itemed his own request, and cut it from \$325,000 down to \$200,000. Does that answer your question?

SENATOR KELLY: Yes, that's my question. That bothers me. And I think Senator Carpenter has helped this Legislature in his motion that would require these agencies requests to go across the Governor's desk before they get here. I think that is an outstanding example of why we need Senator Carpenter's leadership in that area.

SENATOR MARVEL: Well, part of it is that you cut \$125,000 off of your own request, and then you turn around and take credit for it, and club the Legislature for spending too much money.

PRESIDENT: Senator Snyder, DO YOU have a question?

SENATOR SNYDER: Yes, Mr. President. Senator Marvel, I don't want to prolong this either, but I do have a question since one of the items you mentioned concerned the bill that I had. Still have it, but I may not if this goes through I guess. LB92 was my bill. We worked on for some three years. Within 1053, Agency 13, under Special Education. I want to make sure that I understood you to say that the one and three quarter million dollars sliced here in this veto concerns LB403 and LB92, because LB92 was the bill dealing with the mileage expense for handicapped and trainable mentally retarded children. Are those the two bills that specifically involved in the veto regarding agency 13 and in 1053. And also 102.

SENATOR MARVEL : All right, now let me clarify the explanation. And see if this answers your question. What they have done in the Agency 13, the Department of Education is to cut back to their own original request, and what the Committee did in considering this additional impact of 403 and 92, was to add this additional money. Now, so what we are really saying is that if we do not override this veto, there is less chance for both the operation of 403, at least a portion of 403 and 92 to take place. That's really what we are saying. Now, I'm not sure that answers your question.

SENATOR SNYDER: Well, it does, yes.

PRESIDENT: All right, Now. Senator Nore do you have any further questions? Any further questions. Senator Marvel.

SENATOR MARVEL: Senator Carpenter's motion. If there are no other questions. I move the question.
